Dear Mrs. de Mille:


Our editor feels as I did that Wedgwood's letter about Halifax might be considered as "defensive," if printed at this time, and that it might revive unnecessarily a discussion of the old arguments which were raised against his appointment when it was first announced. We both feel that the letter would have been helpful, as Wedgwood intended it to be, if it could have been printed in January, when it was written. The delay in transit is one of the unfortunate things we have to accept under present conditions.

Inasmuch as we can't use it, I am returning the letter together with the letter and the articles which you were good enough to send me yesterday, and which I read with interest. We don't feel justified in reprinting articles from other papers.
