The grand-strategy here (everywhere) is to end product-taxation because it doubles product-cast and consumer-price, so brainess rollime and labor employment are halved. So the object is to UNTAX everything labor and capital make:—And to do that, say \$25 billion a year, a place must be found for those taxes.

That cannot be another forced or defenseless place such as an income or sales tax: it must be a natural, economic and scientific source of which there is but one:
—The SOCIAL VALUES of the country which are matural resources, city lands, and franchises. Natural because of the simple law that social activity—government—shall only be paid from social values.

THIS TIME WE SHALL POSE our wage-law with its 'Partner-Lawe' as composing the PRO-DUCTION-LAW. The labor law

is that all the product of labor must go to labor. In this division, when class-war ceases and capital is in its true relation to labor, as a sub-division or twin-byother in production,

relation to labor, as a sub-division or twin-brother in production, labor will have ALL the product.

For the present, however, let us consider capital as a separate factor in DIVISION of wealth as

well as in its production.

But Land, in our law, while the first factor in production, NAT-URALLY reduces the cost of product in two distinct ways:—(a) by supply of raw materials on special terms (b) by displacement of all product-taxes with its vast rent-fund.

rent-fund.

Our Law imposes no limit on wages. The Law of Wages is that wages must equal all the wealth the worker produces. The Law includes the exact division of this product with the laborer's only coworker in production according to what each does Such division. what each does. Such division must exclude two present inter-ferences (1) taxation of all pro-ducts: caused by (2) the exemp-tion of basic monopoly. The Law is enforced at this point by Shifting the Taxes from Products to Monopoly.

Land, being the GIFT of Nature or a Creator tho the First Essential to Production and the YIELDING a vast Fund of Economic Rent is NOT an item of cost in production as accessible as omic Rent is NOT an item of cost in production, as necessarily are the wages of labor, and the interest of capital which must be paid in full and on the spot. There is no wage-law now in action because we don't enforce the rent-fund law as included in the wealth production law.

Militarism And Monopoly: A Bad Combination

Compared to Baruch's atomic control proposal, Hitler's bid for worldwide domination shows up as

workwhite tollimated shows up as strictly annateur stuff. In their frantic desire to escape destruction by atomic weapons, many superficial thinkers are willing to rush blindiy into dangers infinitely worse.

infinitely worse.

The waiving of sovereignty, either by veto or otherwise, furnishes no guarantee of security against economic or military hijustice or aggression. In general, the proposition offered is to share atomic secrets when all or a majority of the nations agree:

To denature atomic energy, so that it cannot be used for destructive purposes;

To vest authority in the U.N., to search and seize matter from which atomic weapons may be

To outlaw stomic bombs and their manufacture;

After agreement by a majority of the nations, all nations, whether signatories of such agreement or not, shall be compelled by force, to follow the dictation of the to follow the dictation of U.N. military organization.

U.N. military organization.

This ixresistible military force will then have power to search and inspect the most minute details of the affairs of any nation in the world, to see if its will is being observed.

Deing observed.

The danger of vesting authority so tremendous, in the hands of any body of men, even our own citizens, is greater than even the men-ace of the bomb itself. This is true especially when it may be used to cement for all time, the federated power of monopoly as against the unprivileged of the whole world.

AS TO SEARCH AND SEIZure, the sovereign rights of nations which do not superrise to the proposed agreement are arbitrarily violated and they can be subjected to a ruthless domination, for whatever purposes the central authority dictate I usprivacy of an tarth would be free from the meddling snooping of this power.

Beside this, there being some 197,009,000 square miles involved, what chance would there be of successfully inspecting such a vast

As to depatoring atomic As to denaturing atomic energy, it is in nowise certain that this can be done successfully.

If the U.N. had been functioning

If the C.N. had been functioning when Hitler was just rising to power, and he wasn't so well known for what he was, how much do you suppose his delegates could have been trusted not to use ato-

nic knowledge for purposes which they have used other power? There are other Hitlers,—per-haps even here. What proof have haps even here. What proof have we that the U.N. doesn't contain international gunmen?

It is a strange coincidence that the present U.N. Secretary's name sounds suspiciously like "Trigger Lee,"

Arc there these so simple as to believe that a fascist would keep his word, in or outside a U.N.? Nearly all the delegates of the various nations to the U.N., at

present do not actually repre their own people, but simply holders of monopoly in their countries. As a matter of fact, our own people have had practically nothing to say about who should represent them either.

AS A RESULT OF THAT POLicy privilege overwhelmingly dominates even our delegation mates even our delegation. Give that aggregation sole military power and they will surely make certain that they and their kind keep those monopolistic privileges. Another thing to be considered is, what if Russia or Argentina or Snath etc. won't cape into the

Spain, etc., won't come : project and surrender the ereign power; is it planned to attack them and compel them to do so? This would insure the Bloody struggle which the UN is supposed

don't believe for an instant that Russia or Argentina or Spain would keep a promise not to make atomic bombs; and I am not too certain that our own militarists could be trusted either.

Suppose Russia actually has atomic bombs right now; attempts of the U.N. to correct that country, under such circumstances would bring on a struggle too horrible to contemplate.

which control production of any kind of wealth whatever, is essen-tial to peace. Not only that, but it would bring to the world for the first time in human history, sanity, free enterprise, and democracy.

E shall specify just what they embrace and then go on to offer a rational solution for the horrible mess into which the whole world has sunk, despite the guidance what professes to be the last we in economic knowledge.

Monopoly and special privilege may be divided into two great classes: (1) Natural monopoly, and Legislatively created mono-

In the first class are all the natural metallic and crude chemical deposits in the earth, and land value itself. Embraced in this class fication are all the natural agencies which cannot be duplicatagencies which cannot be copined of artificially, and without which no creation of wealth of any kind may be effected. It also includes the kinetic energy of falling water and that immensely important item of petroleum, etc.

of petroleum, etc.
Legislative monopolies are those which are created by first of legislation. They embrace complete or partial monopoly of furnishing service exclusively, to the people, and in which public property must be used. They cover railroads, shipping terminals, tariffs, subsidies however, never necessities. dies, bonuses, patent monopolies, communication facilities, etc.

It is when the great powers clash in maneuvering for position in the weaker NATIONS, over natural resources, that wars are brewed. Whatever issues are dragged in to justify their actions in seading the great of the product of the p ged in to justify their actions in geading the people to armed con-flict, never for a moment forget, that they are fighting for natural resources. The present mess Iran is actuated by what?

In the East Indies and then places it is oil, metals and other natural agencies which cannot be duplicated artificially.

GIVE ME UNQUESTIONED tifle to the only well in the com-munity, and I'll make the people of that community my slaves. Permit the earth's natural resources to remain in private hands as at present, (or in Fascist hands) and not only will those monopolists make the rest of the world slave, but they will control attent military power as well. It makes no difference whether the benefits of a monopoly are divided between just two men, or two thousand; those on the outside are just as much on the outside.

Sovereignty is always claimed in the name of the people. In re-covering the gifts of nature to the people, for their ase, without trib-ute to private interests, according to a rational process, there is no surrender of sovereignty, but an affirmation of such sovereignty in their interest. If there must be surrender of national sovereignty, let it be surrender of the use of sovereignty of individual nations, to protect the private monopolists in their respective countries who hog the gifts of nature to all the race. In other words, "Those who saw them first."

You ask how could this be done? The U. N. should create a "Natural Resources Commission," which should make a complete survey over the whole world, to discover and develop such natural agencies where they occur. This inthen proceed to produce the yield of those gifts of nature to all men, in their crude form and release such crude yield to all comers of all nations, at strict cost of produc-tion and at the same price to all, for PRIVATE FABRICATION OR REFINEMENT. This process would not mean Communism, but
