Rupert Mason's profound and useful statement to bolster and useful statement to constraint statement to constraint fallow that the George Remedy will not effect the full payment for the "privilege" as Mason properly describes LAND MONOPOLY. ## IS LAND BOTH A PRODUCTIVE AND COST FACTOR?
