Macklin, who translated Progress and Poverty and Protection of Free Trade into Chinese in collaboration with Li Yu Shu and Tao Lung Chwang, Chinese scholers, recently wrote to Anna George de Fille, President of the Board of Trustees of the Tenry George School of Social Science, urging that the consul in every city where there is a Chinese Consulate should be approached with copies of Progress and Poverty and Protection or Free Trade for the officers of the consulate who read English and in Chinese for those who do not. The lettee was written on a typewriter presented to Dr. Facilin many years ago by Joseph Pels, who contributed generously to keep alive the name and the philosophy of Henry George until his death in 1914.

"Macklin of Manking," by Edith Eberle, tells the story of the life of this Ontario born missionary who spent forty years in China as a physician and teacher of the philosophy of Menry George. (Bothany Press, St. Louis, No.)

Through Poah D. Alper, Secretary of the San Francisco Extension of the Henry George School, she hopes to have them widely distributed both in Can Francisco and Los Angeles.
