WELCOME TO NEW YORK!

NEW YORK was the scene of the National Conference of the Henry George Foundation of America in 1935; the International Conference for Land Value Taxation and Free Trade in 1939, on the occasion of the Centenary of Henry George; and the First Annual Conference of the Henry George School of Social Science in 1941. (The second, third and fourth Annual Conferences were held in Chicago, 1946, 1947 and 1948.) New York will again be host to the Fifth Annual Conference of the Henry George School.

Out-of-towners will find comfortable accommodations at the air-conditioned Hotel Commodore, centrally located at 42nd Street and Lexington Avenue, next to Grand Central Station, and within easy distance of the Henry George School. (I.R.T. subway, uptown local, from Grand Central to 68th Street; or Madison Avenue bus, uptown, to 68th Street. The Henry George School is on 69th Street between Park and Madison Avenues.)

The theme of this Conference is EDUCATION FOR FREEDOM.

The Friday and Saturday sessions at the Henry George School will be given to panel discussions on School matters. Of more general interest are the events at the Hotel Commodore at which persons prominent in public affairs are scheduled to speak. The Sunday bus tour will include points of interest in lower Manhattan, such as the East Side, Wall Street, the Battery, the markets and Greenwich Village. Newark, N.J., will be host to the Sunday afternoon session.

Special arrangements have been made with The New York Public Library to display part of its famous Henry George collection, including manuscripts, letters, photographs, first editions, etc. This exhibit will be on display all during the Conference, at the Library, Fifth Avenue and 42nd Street. Hours 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.

Though our Conference will be held in mid-summer, there will be many activities going on in the city. It would be worth while to arrange to stay in New York a few extra days to take in some of the sights and events.
