Gift of a New Edition. On September 11, the 75th anniversary of Henry George's application for copyright on his Progress and Poverty, a new edition of the work was presented to the Library as a gift from the Robert Schalkenbach Foundation of New York. The anniversary edition was published by the Schalkenbach Foundation at Country Life Press Garden City, and was designed by Wallace Kibbee of San Francisco. It is a revision of the original text and contains a comprehensive index and a glossary. A party of 15 came from New York for the occasion, and Mr. Robert Clancey, director of the Henry George School of Social Science in New York, made the presentation. Mr. Robert E. Allen, Jr., director of the Washington-Baltimore extension of the school, was present with a group of local students. Later Mr. Herbert Sanborn, Exhibits Officer, escorted the visitors on a tour of exhibits, beginning with the current Exhibit-of-the-Month, which commemorates the anniversary of the first edition of George's book.
