Healthy community weekly in southern New Hampshire (only 33 miles from Boston) is looking for reporter or editor with at least half the curiosity and gumption of former *San Francisco Times* typesetter—editor, Henry George (Nov. 5, 1866 to Aug. 12, 1868).

Must be willing to earn his or her pay in job which can sometimes be humdrum, but is chance for journalist literate in economics to ask right questions at right time and get paid going rate for doing so.

Newspaper is recognized advocate of Georgist principles in a state with neither general sales nor income tax, but nevertheless still needs to understand fully why its economy is so sound.

Paper's first job, it should be understood, is to serve day-to-day needs of three rapidly growing towns, ideology notwithstanding.

Experience needed: Open-ended, with pay scale determined by qualifications.
