
The Lakeside conference demonstrated beyond question that onstrated beyond question that the single tax is still alive, but it also made it plain that the modern Georgists have a long, way to go before they regain the position their predecessors held in the last century:

Few any longer deny that Henry George was one of the outstanding original thinkers produced in this country. The late John Dewey wrote of George that "it would require less than the fingers of the two hands to enumerate those who from Plato down rank with him."

There was much more to George's philosophy than the single tax-for instance, he was one of the great apostles of free trade-but his solution to the land problem was always the key to his system of social reform.

GEORGE WAS BORN in Philadelphia in 1639 and became a printer. He joined the throng of immigrants to the West in the 1850s and observed the effects of land speculation in the boom towns of California. George was bitterly poor during most of the time he lived in the West, and he became convinced that land mon-cleveland. In 1837, George was chert was Tom L. Johnson, or poly was the cause of poverty.
