BACK TO THE LAND by Dr. Thomas Nulty. Bishop Nulty's letter to the clergy and laity of Meath, Ireland, written in 1881 during the height of the Irish Land League's struggle against the Irish landlords. A forthright call for the land for the people via the rent of land as Henry George advocated eight years later in *Progress & Poverty*. Neither George nor Dr. Nulty knew of the existence of each other until after their works had been published.

CANBERRA IN CRISIS by Frank Brennan (legal officer in the Attorney General's Department). Gripping story of the great Canberra land scandal. The main concern of the book is the origin and progress of the Canberra leasehold system which, though admirably conceived, was eventually betrayed by legislators.

THE CONDITION OF LABOUR by Henry George. Written and first published in 1891 in reply to an Encyclical Letter, entitled *Rerum Novarum*, which had been issued by Pope Leo XIII in May of that year, and which dealt with the condition of labouring people throughout the world. Contains the Encyclical, Dr. Edward McGlynn's statement and Bishop Nulty's essay on the land question. Presents the social philosophy of equal rights in simple, eloquent language. Possibly the best brief statement of George's economic and social philosophy.

The great truth that lies at the foundation of all human society, namely, that the interests of all men are fundamentally compatible, that there is and can be no antagonism between the welfare of one and the welfare of all provided there is a free market in which goods and services are voluntarily exchanged. The author refutes the contrary doctrine which is the basis of every variety of collectivism, namely that there is an irreconcilable antagonism between the interests of different social classes, races, nations, industries, etc. Original French edition published in 1850.
