According to the New Holland division of Sperry Rand, because of improved production farmers use less land than they did twelve years ago. They now use about one half of the available crop-land in the U.S.A.. It seems that vacant space is INCREASING.

Federal departments of Agriculture recommend the growing of corn using poisons. Now the farmers' tractors are equipped with spray tanks not cultivating times. When the corn is through the whole area is poisoned. This sets back the corn, but it kills weeds. Later the poisoning is repeated. Result, - less labour to grow corn, more poisons leaching into the streams and oceans, people moving from the farms, Canadian farmers trying to keep out U.S. corn.

although the prices of produce have remained almost constant. One cause is the demand for small acreages on which families may be raised in healthful activity. It does not pay to attempt to raise crops for sale, the large-scale operators produce so cheaply.
