Your November 29th letter indicated you were planning an advertisment in "UU World". I am not familiar with that publication; however, please utilize the Council's address as the source where information, etc. can be obtained.

Finally, we in Philadelphia are facing a very strong challange to the legislation supported by the Incentive Tax League. Councilmember James Tayoun has given us the word. The landed interests have mobilized; only a thorough program of public education and media esposure will overcome the pressure being placed on those supporting the land value taxation bill.
