Rose and Maurice Schotland are old friends of the Henry George School here in New Jersey. That is to say, they both joined a class in fundamentals led by Louis Perna in 1949. And as his students always do, Mr. Schotland commented on Louis interesting presentation of our concepts and of his excellent rapport with his group.

Previous to this time, Mr. Schotland fulfilled the above title in that he has been for many years a good friend of Alex Goldfinger, who is the Dean of the school. So it is obvious that these friends came because of his enthusiasm.

And how about that other old interest, economics? He could exchange his many fascinating experiences in altering part of the earth with our further accounts of how we would like to influence it, if not change it.

Now, I recall that it was a friend who caused Rose and Maurice Schotland to come to study economics at the Henry George School.
