# Editor Reviews Own Book, Finds it Meritorious

Steven Cord has just published Society at the Crossroads (subtitled "Choosing the Right Road"). He seems to approve of it. These are the main points he makes:

Moral decline is responsible for the high crime rate, extensive hard-drug use, violence in entertainment, widespread poverty, family & school dissolution, and other social dysfunctions we suffer from. This book presents literally hundreds of specific facts to support this claim.

But why this moral decline? It is primarily because most Americans are assuming no ethical standard can be proven true. This moral attitude is called ethical relativism (but by its own admission it cannot be proven true because it is itself an ethical standard!).

Throughout the last thousand years of western history, ethical relativism has been on the rise.

The *only* ethical standard that can be proven true is equal rights, because it logically follows from the *only* provable "should" statement that can be made. The proof of equal rights is simple but important. Equal rights are rare in history (and in the world today);

they can never be taken for granted

Historically, philosophers have tried to prove equal rights *directly*, but they have all failed because this cannot be done.

When we object to murder, sex & race discrimination, and robbery, are we not according to other people their equal rights to life, liberty, and property? But wouldn't a proof be more powerful than mere opinion?

If a society preaches ethical relativism, shouldn't it expect all sorts of social problems? Isn't it

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
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## 2-Rate Victory in Virginia!

We are happy to report the city of Fairfax, Virginia can now tax buildings at a lower rate than the land on which they are located, as the result of overwhelming passage of a bill in the Virginia state legislature and signed by the governor. Rest assured that HGFA played a prominent part in this two-rate victory.

The request originated from a recommendation by a City Councilappointed task force created to study tax policy. Delegate Chapman Petersen (D), a former Fairfax councilman, sponsored the legislation.

Councilman Anthony Coughlan, who took a leading role in advocating the two-rate tax, said, "I am very pleased that the City will have the option to implement split-rate taxation. We are the first jurisdiction in the Commonwealth to have this enabling legislation." The City Council will discuss this new option at an upcoming Work Session.

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

- Sethical relativism asserts that no ethical statement can be proven valid, but it can never be proven valid because it is itself an ethical standard.
- S-HGFA is the only existing Georgist organization to get some LVT levied. Assessment reform is certainly possible by employed assessors, but it has not yet provided us with objective studies showing that LVT works.
- Stock donations offer two tax breaks: (1) by giving appreciated stock to CSE, you can escape tax on the capital gains, and (2) you can get a tax deduction for the full market value of the stock donation. Ask your lawyer, or we will provide one free.
- It is incumbent upon those who believe that land speculation lowers wages and interest more than technological progress raises them, and that poverty is an inevitable concomitant of progress, to provide hard facts to support their case

#### Single Tax Good, Marginal-Land Analysis Bad

Henry George was 100% eloquent and incisive concerning the Single Tax, but wrong, I think, on the marginal-land analysis.

- 1.Technological progress has clearly increased tremendously since 1879. It has increased wages and interest far more than land speculation has decreased them.
- 2. Believers in the marginalland theory must assert that wages and interest have been at or near

the subsistence level since 1879, but this clearly cannot be empirically sustained and brings not only the marginal-land analysis but also the Single Tax theory, which they assert is based on it, into disrepute.

3. Fortunately, the Single Tax can be justified on its own merits quite apart from the false marginal-land analysis.
