"If you decide to consult a private tax practitioner, be sure he is well qualified," begs the Internal Revenue Service in a special statement to PARADE. "You can get the names of such experts from any business association, your bank or bankers association; your lawyer or bar association; from local associations of certified or public accountants; or from Better Business Bureaus and Chambers of Commerce."

"Many taxpayers pay out money for just being lazy," an enforcement official said. "They go to some shady character, and he gives them a stiff bill. If they came down here, we'd help them for nothing."

WHAT DOES SOCIAL CREDIT STAND FOR?

Social Credit places great emphasis on he money and economic systems, because hese rule our lives, but Social Credit is nuch more than a reform of the financial system; it is a PHILOSOPHY of life. There are two groups opposed to Social Credit, one representing huge vested financial increases, the other representing the Socialist cosses. They both appear to oppose each other, but unite in opposing Social Credit. I heir opposition to each other is a sham as hey both serve the same master, the Gollen Image of so-called sound finance or lebt-money and the power that goes with it.

THE POLICY OF THIS "SOUND FINANCE," directed to make it effective, develops into a system of economic compulsion and stringency, while the policy of Socialism tends steadily towards control of the individual by the state. Both of these policies lead to a system of centralized conrol in the hands of a few — one through finance, the other through bureaucracy.

Both tend to destroy individual initiative—elimination of private enterprise. Both represent the will-to-power—one by money ontrol, the other by political and social regarization. Both suppress individual freedom—one by economic compulsion, the other by economic regimentation. Both have alse ideals of an economic system—one as a means to provide employment.

Both believe that men exist to serve system—one because it worships the spremacy of finance, the other because worships the state. e su-

Instead of the word "Social" we could see "Public," "Community," "People's," or Societies," they all mean the same and uggests "Association," The word "Credit" uggests "helief" and so "Social Credit is the belief inherent in Society that its individual members in association can obtain the results they want." In the financial ease it is the financial credit of the people as a whole. The term has nothing to do with Socialism which aims at regimentation, he very opposite to Social Credit.


