

Boston, Nov. 23, 1908.

Meeting of Executive Committee of Mass. S. T. League held at 68 Essex Street on the above date. Present - Brazier, Colby, Crosman, Fillebrown, Lothrop, Peabody, Mr. and Mrs. Twitchell. W. L. Crosman was requested to act as Secretary in the absence of Mrs. Mills. On motion Mr. Peabody was elected chairman of the Executive Committee. On motion Mrs. Mills was elected to serve as Secretary of the Executive Committee. Messrs Twitchell and Pike were proposed as members of the Executive Committee. A discussion took place for and against extending to Mr. Pike a place on the Committee. The following were also named: Robert B. Martin of Hyde Park, Henry Sterling, Medford, Sophie E. Haven, Pineknay St. Dr. P. J. Timmins, South Boston, W. J. Isider, 66 Appleton St. Boston.

Mr. Colby stated that he believed the people in Hyde Park were ripe for a public meeting, because of a high tax rate, low rate of assessment on vacant land, and numerous object lessons in regard to inequality in assessments. He believed the Y. M. C. A. would furnish hall free, the League to furnish speakers, and pay an entertainer who would furnish entertainment for an audience. He also believed that one of the best ways to get converts was by getting high school boys and members of Young Men's congresses interested. Moved and seconded that Mr. Colby be a committee of one to arrange with Mr. Logan, Secy. of Y. M. C. A. for a meeting in Hyde Park such as he proposed. carried. ✓

Mr. Brazier believed a special effort should be made to reach working men through their unions and smoke talks.

Mr. Lothrop believed that the best way to open propaganda work this season was to have a public meeting, at which Gov. Garvin of Rhode Island would be the principal speaker. Moved that the Chairman appoint a committee of three to prepare a definite plan for covering the suggestions made for propaganda work. No vote taken. Moved that Mr. Colby be instructed to canvass the field along the lines he has talked on. Moved that Mr. Grosman be a committee of one to look up the matter in regard to the labor organizations, and to try and induce them to have speakers from this League. Carried. That Mr. Lothrop be a committee of one to work up a public meeting at which Governor Garvin would speak. Carried.

Adjourned to meet again on Dec. 21st unless there is a special call.
