Mr. Carret read a letter from Antonio Albendin, a Singletaxer of Spain. No action taken.

Voted to refer Mr. Sterling's project, ~~ref~~ mentioned above, to the committee on propaganda with the suggestion that a quotation from Mr. Louper's Atlanta speech be incorporated in the circular.

No other business coming before the committee, Mr. Chase was asked to tell of the work of the Feb Fund Commission in Rhode Island. Much work had been done but the ~~work~~ results were very meager and it is questionable if the expense was justified. Mr. Chase was not encouraged to solicit for the Feb Fund from Massachusetts singletaxers.
