

U'REN LAYS SINGLE TAX GHOST.

I wish to say to those of my friends who support me on other measures, but are afraid of the single tax, that I accept the vote of the people in 1912 on that question. If I am elected Governor I shall not support any single-tax measure during my four years of office, nor any greater exemption than the \$1500 of dwelling-house, livestock, machinery, buildings, cost of clearing land, growing orchards, etc., which is now pending before the people. If the advocates of the single-tax principle are wise they will allow the voters a reasonable period for study and reflection before submitting the question again.
