Dear Anderson:

You perhaps knew that Chase and Sanborn have been sponsoring "The Good Will Court", and have just dropped it because of legal questions raised by our Attorney-General. What the merits of this feature or of the reasons why they have dropped it, are beside the point: but I understand that it was very highly rated and highly paid for.

I have been working with Dr. Samuel Buchler who originated "The Jewish Court of Arbitration" -- a dozen years ago -- and has operated it continuously since, and settled something like 10,000 cases. This Court is therefore established, successful, legalized, etc: and I am working with him to 'anglicize' it, which is being rapidly done.

Here is the proposition Chase & Sanborn should have and it is not one that can be touched by the lawyers or judges, or Attorney-Generals, who are always ready to tear down anything that competes with legalism.

I am writing you, knowing your prominence in the Chase & Sanborn organization, on the possibility of your being able to assist me to get in at their front door: or otherwise, to tell me where their business is done and possibly whom to see or write.


Dear Mr. Ingersoll:--
