DECLARATION OF PRINCIPLES.

We assert as our fundamental principle the self evident truth enunciated in the Declaration of American Independence, that all men are created equal, and are endowed by their Creator with certain inalienable rights.

We hold that all men are equally entitled to the use and enjoyment of what God has created and of what is gained by the general growth and improvement of the community of which they are a part. Therefore, no one should be permitted to hold natural opportunities without a fair return to all for any privilege thus accorded to him, and that value which the growth and improvement of the community attached to land should be taken for the use of the community.

We hold that each man is entitled to all that his labor produces. Therefore, no tax should be levied on the products of labor.

To carry out these principles we are in favor of raising all public revenues for national, state, county and municipal purposes by a single tax upon land values, irrespective of improvements, and of the abolition of all other forms of direct or indirect taxation.
