(Ground Rent)

The selling price of land is its net annual rent multiplied by 20. Some land in New York City is worth Forty Million Dollars per acre. Any farm land in Iowa worth that much?

However, this can be changed by a simple scientific expedient

There is one tax which does not increase the cost of living—but on the contrary will lower the cost of living. This is the ad valorem tax on land. Such a tax on ground rent or land values, cannot be shifted, and does not add to prices. Tax land enough in this way and it will become very cheap.

RADIO CITY

Is built upon LAND and Columbia University owns the land and rents the privilege of using it for \$3,300,000 per year, according to a New York Times article. At the expiration of the lease in 2015 the University appropriates the buildings without recompense to the owners.

LAISSEZ FAIRE, LAISSEZ ALLER

Does not mean "Leave things alone, and may the devil catch the hindmost." It does mean what is required at every sporting game like baseball or football. A fair field and no favors.

The true spirit of Laissez Faire is what we propose in Single-Taxism, that each should earn what he gets, and get what he earns. This can be done through science.

LAND-INCOME TAX

We propose a tax, not on land, but upon the income producing power of land, this income being called ground rent. The entire community creates this income which is thus a socially created value. We propose to take this rent to run the government and abolish all other taxes.

ALL JOBS

Are performed on LAND, some on good land, some on poorer land. The best land (the most valuable land) is in and around cities, ranging as high as \$40,000,000 per acre. High prices for land make low wages for labor. The answer to the Labor Problem is to reduce rent—by taxation.

WAGES SEEMS TO ME THE MOST IMPORTANT

Thus spoke Henry George before the Boston, Mass., Typographical Union, February 22, 1889.

Mr. George continued, "If workmen would get anything real and permanent they must go in, not for one great trade union, but for the whole people. . . In seeking the solution of the labor question you come to the land question."
