

## POLITICAL ECONOMIST URGES ADOPTION OF SINGLE TAX PLAN

Charles LeBaron Goeller of Endwell, New York, self-styled political economist and advocate of the single tax, spoke on that subject at the Y.M.C.A. lobby forum last night to about 60 persons. He labeled his talk, "The Solution of the Problem of Low Wages and Unemployment," which he explained, was the adoption of the single tax idea by the nation. He illustrated his talk with stereopticon slides.

Mr. Goeller revealed that he was an ardent supporter of Henry George, the original single tax proponent. The slides he showed depicted bread lines, unemployment scenes, charts and diagrams all tending to prove that the

multiple tax is the cause of many miseries and abuses today. He explained in detail what political economy is and how to study it, showing slides to prove his point that political economy is the science that treats of the nature of wealth and distribution.

He said that if the single tax plan were adopted wages would be trebled and many unemployment headaches, starvation and poverty problems would disappear. He illustrated his talk with the life of Robinson Crusoe, who, he said, started with land the acquired wealth and capital through labor. After his lecture he answered questions.
