With him, justice was the highest form of cle He believed "that God has made ample provision for the needs of all men during their residence earth, and that involuntary poverty is the result of the human laws that allow individuals to his private property that which the Creator provided for the use of all." He steadfastly refused "to rei his rights as an American citizen" to hold and advocate these truths, and after years of extraordinary fice, without retraction on his part, he vindicated his right.

To honor the memory of this American is a public duty.
