Dear Mr Blundell,

I have been pleased to receive Mrs B.P. Sobrielo's letter of 14th October following my election to join the International Union of Land Value Taxation and Free Trade and the welcome as a new member.

At the Week-end School when I met you I was fully satisfied Henry George was right on the cause of industrial depressions. I could not accept he had hit on the answer or that there is only one answer.

I decided that I would look closer at his writings and to understand the reasonings which he puts to paper better by writing myself these as I understand them myself. I had only to write out the first chapter of "The Condition of Labour" in this way to find it possible to fully accept personally his conclusions that a land tax alone can resolve the basic wrongs within social organisation.

I have sought some local publicity as you will see from copies attached since my "conversion". Last night NUAAW President, Mr Hesse, attended a Dinner in my NUAAW District. I am reporting on speed the Dinner to local papers and from copy of report you will see I am seeking further publicity.

Seeing that this exercise in jotting down Henry George's writings using some words of my own to bring out more fully for my satisfaction the truth embodied in his works, I have decided to enclose of this exercise on this first chapter of "The Condition of Labour". This exercise may be helpful to others.

I have not bothered to read these 'ramblings' myself for mistakes before enclosure. If it would be helpful in any way, I could doubt continue throughout the whole of this book in this same manner if the exercise could result in possible publication in order to be generally helpful in communicating the tremendous truth which I am now fully convinced this remarkable man embodied.
