

A helpful staff, including, normally, a resident Social Secretary, anxious to retain the Strawberry Hill reputation of being a happy place to visit


THE CAMPUS —

(In the 1760s visitors to London regarded Mr. Walpole's Gothic Castle as one of the sights to be seen. From 1863-79 Strawberry Hill, under the influence of Lady Frances Waldegrave, was one of the great centres of political and social life in London)
