Dear Friend:

Member / Contributor / Well-wisher / Listener.

Enclosed are two books. One is "The Effective Answer to Communism and Why You Don't Get it in College," by Dr. Harry G. Brown, Professor Emeritus of Economics at the University of Missouri; the other is "Evidence of the New Zealand League for the Taxation of Land Values, Inc.," as presented to the Royal Commission on Local Authority Finance, by Dr. Roland O'Regan of Wellington.

The Public Revenue Education Council deems it important to circulate these books with their recital of experiences and data in the use of Land Value Taxation as a source of public revenue, in contrast to taxes which draw destructively on the rewards of human effort - wages and interest. We have the use of experiences worked out, as it were, in a controlled laboratory experiment. They prove beyond all reasonable doubt the difference in results that follow from the use of these different sources of public revenue. It is news to most people who care; carry the news to them.

We plan to place our supply of these books in the hands of selected educators, public officials, editors of newspapers, leaders of labor and business, in colleges and local communities, and of organizations.

A goodly number of our pamphlets, giving facts and data such as is disclosed in these books, were circulated by the late George Hellick, well-known business man and seeker of economic justice of Easton, Pennsylvania. We are pleased to continue this educational work in some areas of Pennsylvania in memory of Mr. Hellick who encouraged us by his generous approval and use of our educational material.

We invite you to aid us in this work in this way, and to do like work in your community. Loaning out these two books will help to buy more for this purpose - or to give to selected people - will help more.

There was never a greater need for us (You and I) to do educational work. Too many rely on some mythical "They" to do it for them. While we may delegate many things and services to others in all good faith, our responsibility as citizens of the U.S.A. cannot be morally delegated by us; it is ours alone. You and I must do it.

The Public Revenue Education Council has been active the past year. A report will be made of its activities in due time.
