HENRY GEORGE SCHOOL OF SOCIAL SCIENCE:

The Committee is hopeful of securing permanent rooms for the school by a plan of purchasing space in a mid-city building. Should the Committee consider this plan practicable, a special circular will be addressed to members on the matter. The Committee regard the work of the School as the League's most important work and it is already beginning to bear fruit. Mr. R. Keall, the Secretary to the classes, is doing invaluable work in promoting the development of the School.

REVENUE FROM THREE RATING SYSTEMS:

In 1951 the League requested the Minister in charge of the Census and Statistics Department (Hon. J.R. Marshall) to have included in the annual statistical returns of local bodies a statement of the rate revenue levied on each of the three rating systems. To this request the Minister generously acceded and these figures are now published in the Local Authorities Handbook. The returns for the year ended 31st March 1952 are now available and are as follows: -

Note: (a) In areas rating on Capital Value and Annual Value the total rate revenue is £5,655,959. The composite ratio of value of improvements to land value in these areas is as 180 to 100. The figure of item 2 above is obtained by dividing the total revenue figure in this ratio.

(b) Since these figures were compiled Rating on Unimproved Value has been carried in Dunedin City, Clutha County, Taieri County, Coromandel County, Waitemata County, Te Aroha Borough, Shamon Borough, Waihi Borough, Eltham Borough, Kaiapoi Borough, Otautau Town, Nightcaps Town, Waikanae County Township, Tiran County Township.

- (c) Since 1952. Total Local Body revenue has increased.
- (d) Owing to rising valuations Land Tax receipts have increased.

For these reasons it can be safely estimated that total revenue from Land Values is now in the neighbourhood of £13,000,000 a year.
