Explication:

We are not malicious  
with your house -

But if you will occupy  
a SITE in OUR country,  
you have to pay  
for that privilege  
a site-duty.

Full site duty for  
the whole nation  
adds up to the State-budget.

## Lesson 8

Taxation  
according to capacity  
is an equalizer.

Site-duty  
is an equalizer  
in itself.

There will be  
nothing left  
to be redistributed.

For that purpose  
taxation  
will be obsolete.

## Lesson 9

Today  
af the tax budget  
one third is spend  
for government expenses,  
and two thirds  
for re-distribution.

An equal amount of  
Site-duty revenue:  
one third to spend  
for government expenses,  
two thirds .....

"The gifts of nature  
are for the people"

The two thirds left  
after government expenses  
is-for-the-people!

An equal amount  
for every-one  
from birth till dead
