On Sunday, 13th May 1984, the Hon. Clyde R. Cameron A.O. kindly opened the new meeting room and library recently constructed for the South Australian Division of the Henry George League.

In addition to being a highly successful occasion in its own right, it also celebrated the centenary of the first formal meeting of a single tax organisation in this State. It was on 13th May, 1884, that early Georgists held their first meeting at Kapunda, a small country town to the north of Adelaide.

Funds were donated by the Henry George Foundation of Australia and by other friends and supporters.


It is very likely that the name of Cameron is known to you, not only as a Georgist of long-standing but also as one of this country's leading statesmen and a veritable father figure. He was a member of the Cabinet and Minister of Labour in the Whitlam Government. His address was worthy of a national audience and an occasion of considerably greater importance.

That address was entitled 'How Labour Lost It's Way' and will be of interest to Georgists, unionists, historians and economists everywhere. A transcript and tape are enclosed as we have Mr. Cameron's permission to use his material in Georgist publications.

He has already circulated copies to the press and to men of influence in the present Federal Government and in our State Government. We hope that it's effect will be far-reaching and that you will find much that will encourage diligent workers throughout the U.S.
