It turns out that, besides being a University of Wis. graduate student, he is also employed part time as a legislative aide to Wis. Rep. David Helbach (who happily was one of the cosponsors of WPOL-Beloit's 1979 Assembly Joint Resolution 96).

Woody Williams lent me his copy of "For the Land Is Mine," which I showed to an adult discussion group at First Methodist in Beloit in January. Following that my senior pastor and church's lay leader nominated me to the church's Board of Church and Society. I attended a meeting in Madison Feb. 10-11 of IMPACT, (pamphlet enclosed) which is a group of churches oriented toward legislation. I am in the process of writing letters to the director of the Wis.
