

SINGLE TAXERS HEAR OHIOAN

Members of the Henry George Foundation of America, militant disciples of the single-tax theory, today opened a three-day convention in the Congress Hotel.

Mayor William N. McNair of Pittsburgh, scheduled as the main speaker, was called home on business last night and was replaced by Peter Witt, Cleveland consulting engineer. Witt said:

"There should be one tax, and that on the land. The object would be to take ground rent into the public treasury for all the people. It would stop the private appropriation of \$13,600,000,000 of unearned income which is going unjustly into the government treasury."

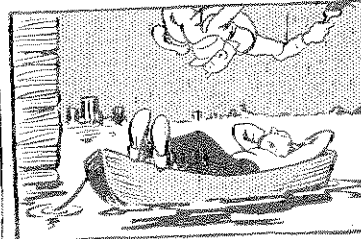
"Ohio has limited taxation of landowners to 1 per cent of the land's value, which will inflate the balloon still more. Some time the balloon will burst."

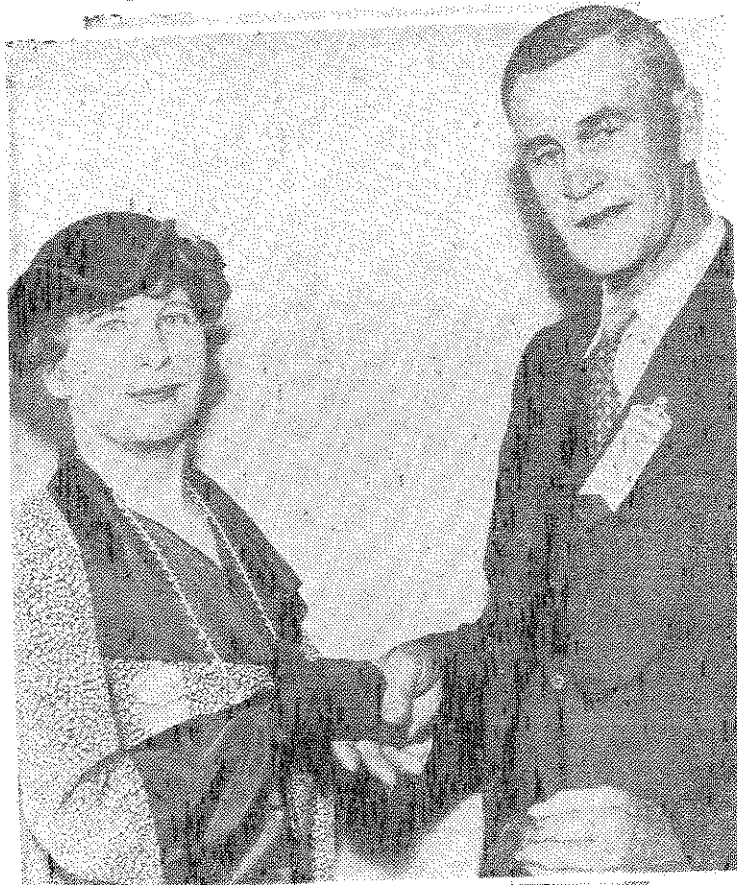
Sits Under Bridge to Catch Pals Who Fall
