during the fall and winter.

Mr. John Z. White of Chicago will begin a tour to  
the Pacific Coast about November 15th going via Salt Lake City, Boise,  
Spokane, Seattle, San Francisco, Los Angeles and New Orleans returning to  
Chicago probably during February. During March Mr. White will be available  
for appointments in and about Chicago. He will then proceed east to the  
Atlantic Coast.

One of the other of these speakers will be available  
for lecture appointments in any city or town of the United States to  
which they may be invited during the ensuing twelve months.

Mr. Bengough's lecture work is confined almost  
entirely to Men's Clubs of Churches and similar organizations. Mr.  
Bengough is willing to accept a silver collection in lieu of fee and ex-  
penses. In regard to Mr. White and Miss Colbron there is no fee the organ-  
izations being free to contribute toward expenses or not according to  
their custom.

The salary and expenses of our speakers is guaranteed by a popular fund

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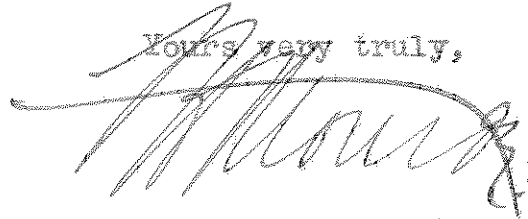
