Here's the manuscript on Women in Georgism -- still needing some work, and of course retyping. But it gives the general tone and scope of what I intend to do -- a story, informative, but not scholarly research. I just hope it gets into print -- not so much to inform Georgists, as to inform the Feminist and Women's Lib. movements.

They tend to welcome things on women in any group -- and they and much of the New Age movement know little or nothing of George. So I think a brief, readable story that emphasizes the women, with just enough of doctrine-principle to entice them further, is a route to get Georgism into that group. This is in line with my effort of some years -- toward a coalition -- dr federation (not union) of groups who move toward freedom and humanizing of the culture. It's that pattern on which my Alternative Americas is built, as you know -- describing nine groups which seem to me currently to merit such inclusion.

We had a coalition meeting Saturday April 21 in DC -- a good group, of people from such groups -- would have been more, but this was pre-Easter Sat. and not a good date, except for a major attraction, Karl Hess, libertarian and drop-out from government. (He was speech writer for Barry Goldwater). Gerogist John Garver presented Georgism; and Dean Ahman, chairman and libertarian, explained their view of land-reform. They still think of "land" as agricultural, ~~and~~ so I'm sending a whole wet of Gerogist lessons to show him how Stan Rubenstein approaches it. (We like those lessons, and have a group started here in York. Got some "new" people from Unitarian and health groups into it.)

So thanks much for going over this! I'd like someone (maybe Mark S.) to do short reports on Margaret Bateman and Strethel Walton. I'll continue on some others -- Suzanne Lafollette, Madam Sunfat Sen (unless you know of quick access to such) and then try to get it in shape for "the press", in another month.
